

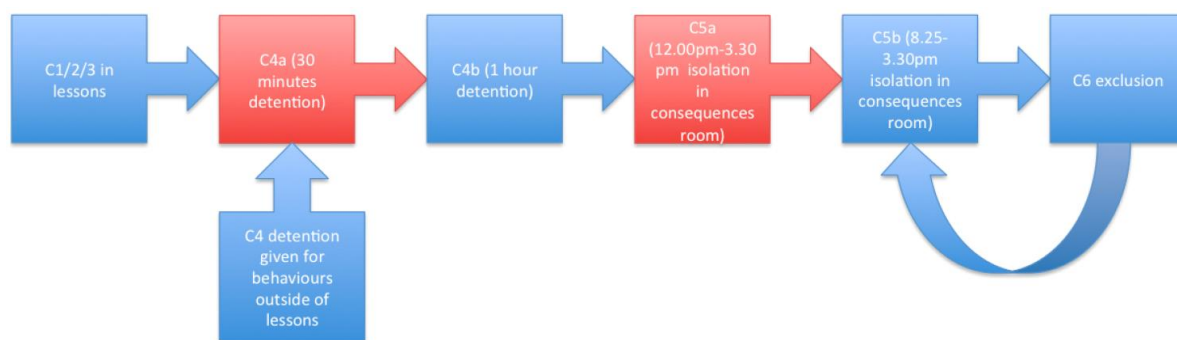

## Behaviour Policy - Consequences

We are trialling some small changes to our behaviour policy at Outwood Academy Danum, with effect from 22 June 2018. The amended policy is now on our website, for your information.

The main additions to the policy are highlighted in the steps below, which you will be familiar with:



In summary:

- Our high standards and expectations of students remain the same;
- Students can be issued with a C4 detention in the same way;
- If a student does reach C4, they will complete a 30 minute detention (C4a);
- If a student does not complete the C4a 30 minute detention, they will have a one-hour detention (C4b);
- If a student does not complete the C4b one-hour detention, then they will have an afternoon in the consequences room, 12 noon to 3.30pm (C5a);
- If a student does not complete the C5a afternoon in the consequences room, then they will have a full day in the consequences room, 8.25am to 3.30pm, (C5b);
- If a student does not complete the C5b full day in the consequences room, then it is likely they will be excluded from the academy and when they return, they will need to repeat their full day in the consequences room. They will not return to lessons until this is completed.

It is better for students to complete any sanction given rather than failing and moving to the next stage. We will endeavour to inform you if your child does not complete a sanction. **This will enable you to speak to them to ensure they complete the next stage successfully.** Please ensure we are informed of any changes to your contact details.

The wealth of rewards, positivity and praise are still very much at the heart of what we do.

If any further changes are made to the policy, we will of course inform you. I would like to thank you for your support of the academy. The letters and comments from parents and carers are overwhelmingly positive about the work we do with your children. Thank you.
