






CAREERS



This term we have continued to look to provide our students with lots of support and guidance in terms of making informed choices with their careers. As part of National Careers Week there was a whole school assembly on Labour Market Information in Doncaster and the surrounding area. Students in Year 7 have been working on elements of careers in their Health and Wellbeing lessons and Y10 and 11 students have continued to receive some valuable input from our new careers advisor Shannon Lidster through careers interviews. On 7th March, we were fortunate enough to have the opportunity to travel to The Racecourse, where our Year 10 and 11 students were able to take part in this year's Opportunities Doncaster Live 2024 event. This is the largest careers fair in South Yorkshire, where hundreds of businesses and prospective Post-16 providers came together to meet students and promote the opportunities and potential career pathways that are available to our students after life at Outwood Academy Danum.

This was a fantastic day for our students to pick up some vital information on the skills, qualities and qualifications that they may need to pursue future careers









On Thursday I4th March, four members of the School Parliament travelled to Elland Road, Leeds to participate in the OGAT Student Voice Conference. This year's theme was Championing Mental Wellbeing and Celebrating Diversity. The conference involved over 35 schools from within the Outwood Family participating in a series of workshops being delivered by some external speakers and organisations which involved students working on strategies around which they could raise the profile of student wellbeing and in particular considering ways in which student diversity could be embraced and celebrated. Students were also privileged to have an audience with our new CEO Mr Wilson, who spoke about the challenges that young people in 2024 face in a technological world where people have so much access to each others' lives. Students worked hard at coming up with ideas that they will bring back to Outwood Academy Danum and share with their peers at Parliament, before preparing to present these to Mrs Crane and the Leadership Team.

Physical Education &

KS4

In core Key Stage 4 PE lessons, students have been participating in a range of sporting activities including badminton, table tennis, dance and basketball. The aim of these sessions has been to refine performance skills and improve accuracy as well as developing an understanding of the benefits of participating in sport once students leave school.

In Year 10 Sport Studies, students have been finishing their 'Knowledge and Skills in Outdoor Activities' unit. They have been researching different outdoor activities available within our region as well as nationally and finding out about the technology and equipment required. Students have also planned their own orienteering session. In Year 11 Sport Studies, students have started to prepare for their exam unit on 'Contemporary Issues in Sport'. Topics looked at so far include user groups who participate in sport, potential participation barriers and the implications of hosting a major sporting event. They have also completed practice exam questions and have been provided with revision resources to continue preparation for their exam at home.



KS3

Basketball

There have been a number of boys basketball fixtures for all year groups this half term. One particular highlight was the Year 9 and 10 game against Wickersley School and Sports College from Rotherham. Both teams played brilliantly but Outwood Academy Danum came out on top with a score of 68-38. They then also went on to take the follow up game 48-44.



Doncaster Indoor Athletics

Maths & % &

Year 8

Learners have been looking at algebra and how the use of brackets affects equations. They have also looked at circles to coincide with Pi Day on the 14th of March.



Year 7

Year 7 have been looking at the area of parallelograms, triangles and trapezium and composite shapes made from these basic shapes. They have also looked at fractions and their conversions between decimals and percentages. Negative numbers and averages have also been taught this term.

Year 9

Pupils have further developed algebra concepts including indices and fractional indices and moving into rational and irrational numbers by studying surds.



Year 10

Year 10 have continued to develop the area of shapes and circles along with perimeter and volume.

Year 12 & 13

Post 16 have been working towards Mock exams and have developed further calculus skills.

Year 11

Year II have worked towards their mock exams and have had a bespoke scheme of work delivered to each class based on the strengths and areas for development of the students.

Enrichment

After school Maths has been attended very well over the term and students are already seeing progress in their Mock exam scores and grades.

Homework club is available on Thursday in 164 for students to complete their Sparx.

Year 7

Year 7 have now completed two immersive read books. It has been great for staff to prioritise reading with the classes and we are seeing an increase in reading ages. We cannot wait to start reading our first play text. How To Be A Kid!



Year 9 have finished the Woman In Black and are close to finishing Heroes. It is wonderful to have the opportunity to read two full novels each year. We are starting to prepare for the beginning of our GCSE curriculum by working on our writing skills, particularly writing formal and informal letters.



English

Year 8

Year 8 are about to begin studying their
Shakespeare text for this year, which is Much
Ado About Nothing. Staff have been working
hard to build students' confidence in the
language and make sure the unit is engaging. We
are looking forward to hosting a movie night
where students can watch the play.

Y12 & 13

Post 16 students are working very hard at the moment. They are taking full advantage of the additional revision events we are putting on. Literature students are finishing their work on Tragedy and are now looking at Social Protest writing. In A Level English Language students are starting to look at language acquisition and Language and Gender.

Year 11 continue to work extremely hard. There is a packed programme ensuring all aspects of GCSE English Literature and English Language are revised fully. Many of our students are extremely engaged in the 100 days of literature challenge, maintaining a strong streak! A reminder that homework is set on google classroom each week.



Year 10

Year 10 have started to study Macbeth and were fortunate to travel up the M1 for a school trip to Leeds Playhouse to watch a performance. For year 10 we have changed our GCSE texts to Macbeth and An Inspector Calls. Our staff cannot wait for change and we are sure the students will be excited by the new choices.

Enrichment

Pokemon club and journalism club remain popular key stage 3 choices. Students are working towards putting together a newspaper on a monthly basis.

Year II after school English is on a Monday night. This is a chance for students to revise with staff, get expert masterclasses and complete any homework with some staff help.

KS3

Year 7 have been looking at development this half term and discovering why wealth is uneven across the world! Year 7 are now beginning to speak like geographers and are banned from saying the rich and poor! This topic enables our Year 7 students to really understand the world around them before we dive into case studies!

This half term Year 8 have investigated how two people died in Venice; how sustainable Outwood Academy Danum is and debated whether Miss Parkhurst should visit the Maldives - all linking to climate change!

Year 9 finished studying all about natural hazards this half term - with all the news about Icelandic eruptions - it really did rock!

Brama & Performing Arts



Year 7

Y7 students in drama have explored the David Walliams novel The Boy in the Dress learning about characterisation skills as well as life skills such as tolerance and respect. The learning journey continued with Roald Dahl's classic, Matilda using synchronised movement, physical theatre and choral speaking in order to create work.

Year 8

Y8 learners began with a devised unit based on the nursery rhyme of Jack and Jill, a family saga of money, power, secrets and lies. This encouraged students to employ conflicting characters and devise from a stimulus. We have also studied the popular theatre practitioner, John Godber including extracts from his plays such as Teechers.

Year 9

Y9 pupils delved into Dennis Kelly's DNA, where a group of teens commit a crime and try to cover the whole thing up. Each week students read an extract before performing work from the play and based on key themes. This allowed students to take inspiration into our Big Issue topic, taking popular teenage issues and staging them: exam stress to vaping and substance misuse to stealing!

Year 10/11

Y10 and Y11 have undertaken work for their exam courses: Eduqas Vocational Tech Award for Y10 and BTEC Performing Arts for Y11. Year 11 are completing their component 3 responding to a brief and year 10 have been devising for their unit 2 performance exam.

Trips & Events

There have been lots of exciting opportunities happening in Music. A Level Music students enjoyed a visit to Leeds Arena to watch 'Jurassic Park in Concert', while the renowned award-winning John Williams score is performed live by a full orchestra.

The Piano Celebration Concert was a huge success and gave our wonderful KS4 & 5 pianists the opportunity to play our Yamaha Grand Piano alongside our excellent piano tutor Ralph Brown. Parents, friends and carers gave a standing ovation to the young performers at the end of the concert.

WeCompose24 was launched in January to our KS4 & 5 music students with an introductory concert performed by the Ligeti Quartet. Students were introduced to a wide range of string repertoire and tools for composition.

KS3

Yr 7, 8 & 9 students have been studying Rhythm, how to create variations on a famous theme and developing their Ukulele Skills in half-term 3 and this half-term all of our KS3 students are learning to sing original and well known songs in 3 part harmony, leading to an opportunity to take part in Doncaster's very own annual massed singing event - iSing on Wed 24th April 2024.



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KS4 & 5

KS4 & 5 music students are working very hard on their String Quartet compositions which will be performed live by the Ligeti String Quartet in a culmination concert at Cast Theatre on Thurs 4th July. Students can share their progress with you at home through Soundtrap or Musescore.

Instrumental Practice takes place on Friday afternoons in our two practice rooms and this allows space, time and access to instruments for our budding musicians in all year groups.

Year 10

Engineering-the students are learning machine shop skills, producing exceptional quality products, they are proud to show their work. Theory work is focused on key skills of Engineering such as identification of materials for a product, alternatives and justification.

Catering-we have super young Chefs! The students are learning and developing complex skills producing amazing dishes such as raspberry bavarois. They have been learning underpinning knowledge relating to macro and micro nutrients, impact of the economy, types of food services offered in provision.

Hair & Beauty-The students have been learning about hair and beauty from Ancient times to the 21st Century, linking ingredients that are still used today! Investigating the alternatives to animal testing of cosmetic products and the function of ingredients. The students made a lip balm from an ancient Egyptian recipe, evaluating the effectiveness and quality against modern products. Health & Social Care-the students have completed the Component I input relating to human development and are now busy immersed in the Component I assessment. They are applying taught knowledge to a brief. They are showing tenacity and determination to produce their very highest quality work. We are super proud of their resilience.

Post-16



Year 7

Year 7 have worked on the topic of 'free time activities' in Spanish and are in the middle of doing the same in French before we work on 'family' in Spanish after Easter.

The recent assessment in Spanish was focused on writing and an achievement test in French which covers listening, reading, writing and speaking skills.



Year 8

Year 8 are about to begin studying about French and Spanish festivals and celebrations after covering the topic of holidays. The students have just completed a speaking assessment - a picture card accompanied by two questions.

Year 9

Year 9 for their part have focused on the topic of food and drinks/healthy lifestyle as well as daily routine. The assessment was a role play which was later followed by a read aloud task and translation task. They will follow this with the topic of global issues.



Enrichment

The popular Culture Club for KS3 students is running on Wednesdays now. The students are working on writing their own story in Spanish.

Fridays enrichment sessions are running for year 11 where students are working on their own weaker skills under the supervision of their teacher.

Some Easter revision sessions will be held during half term: French Wednesday 3 April, 9:30 to 12:30 and Spanish 9 April, 10:00 to 14:00.



Year 10/11

Year 10 have been doing house/home and region as well as school life and studies, resulting in end of unit assessments with a focus on listening, reading and writing skills.

Year 11 continue to work extremely hard. They are working on all four skills required for the MFL GCSE: Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing. They worked on their Speaking prior to the Speaking Mock exam. They then revisited the following topics: Leisure, Family, Technology, House and Home, Holidays, My studies and Life at school but this time working on Listening, Reading and Listening as well as Speaking.

Y11 Spanish and French will be revising and honing their exam speaking exams which will be taking place week commencing 22nd. Year 11 Home Languages students are working hard too. Our very own Mrs Beaumont is supporting a pupil doing Chinese Mandarin and our EAL teacher Mrs Gancewska will be doing our Polish speaking exams. Mrs Baynham at OAD Adwick is helping with the Italian and support for our Turkish, Portuguese and Urdu students is coming from Doncaster Council. Russian speaking exams will be conducted by our MFL Director Mrs Harris-Jukes.

Homework is being set on Languagenut on a weekly basis from this half term.



Key Stage 3:

Across Year 8 and Year 9 students have been introduced to Small Basic.

This is allowing students the opportunity to learn how to program. Writing code in Small Basic introduces the three programming constructs sequence, selection and iteration. Not only does this module teach students how to code, it also builds a lot of skills, especially resilience. Coding isn't for the faint hearted however, watching students build confidence and resilience over the past few lessons has been nothing but heartwarming.

Key Stage 4:

Year 10 have been working hard through the WJEC Unit 1 theory module over the past few lessons. Year 10 are now starting to prepare their practice coursework pieces so they are ready for Year 11.

Year II have been working extremely hard to complete their WJEC Coursework. All students have been focusing on picking up as many marks as possible over the 4 tasks. The resilience shown by Year II during such a demanding time of the year has been outstanding.

Key Stage 5:

Year 12 Computer Scientists have been focusing on Component 2 which focuses on thinking abstractly, procedurally, logically, software development and algorithms.

Working collaboratively on bubble and insertion sorts, binary and linear searches has been fantastic to witness.

Year 12 have a busy 2 weeks upcoming for mocks however, once they are completed they are looking forward to making a start on their projects.
