For every child registered for Free School Meals, Outwood Academy Danum will get £985. With this money we could add extra support for students in classes, or provide I to I support where needed. - 5. No one will know you have applied and your child's friends will not know. They will automatically have cash on their account every day.

## Free School Meals - Do you qualify?

You can register your child for Free School Meals if you receive:

- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit as long as you have a yearly household income of less than
  £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) and you do not get Working Tax
  Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working tax Credit)
- Universal Credit
